Give Kids A Smile Overview Be Part of the Movement

Background Information

Give Kids A Smile® was launched nationally by the American Dental Association in 2003. The program has grown over its 20-year history due to the dedication and collaboration of the ADA, Henry Schein Cares, Colgate and other sponsoring organizations and individuals. GKAS events launch annually on the first Friday in February, which is national Give Kids A Smile Kickoff Day. Events then take place throughout the year in different cities across the country.

The ADA provides tools and resources for local GKAS program coordinators so they can focus on what they do best: providing much-needed oral health care to children in underserved communities. Each year, approximately 7,000 dentists and 30,000 dental team members volunteer at GKAS events in their communities to provide free oral health education, dental screenings and treatment to about 300,000 children. To date, over 6 million underserved children have received free oral health services through GKAS.

We invite your dental association to join us in this national GKAS effort, and help inspire your members to Be Part of the Movement!

Purpose of the Guide

This document provides useful information and resources to assist state and local dental associations on how they may participate in the ADA Give Kids A Smile program.

GKAS Event Types

Education Only

The Education Only event includes oral health education, with NO other oral health services provided during the event. Education Only events generally take place in a school setting with the use of posters, props, games and handouts.

Screening

The Screening event delivers oral health education, visual oral screening, and fluoride varnish applications. This type of event is generally not held in a clinical setting. Therefore, sealants and/or restorative treatment are NOT provided. The event may be held in a school auditorium, museum, or mobile van setting.

Preventive/Restorative

The Preventive/Restorative event delivers oral health education, screening exam, X-rays, fluoride varnish, dental sealants, extractions, pulpotomies, etc. This type of event takes place in a clinical setting, such as a dental office, dental school, or clinic.

GKAS National Resources

Event Registration for Those Hosting a GKAS Event

- Registration opens on October 1.
- Events registered by November 15th may request free product kits to support the event. GKAS product kits are donated by our national sponsors, Colgate and Henry Schein Cares.
- We ask that you please continue to register all planned GKAS events even after the product request deadline, so that we will be able to report accurate and current data for the year.



Dental Association Administrative Tasks


- Promote GKAS to your local dentists via meetings, your dental association website, email blasts to your members, your e-newsletter, etc. to expand coverage in your state.
- Assist local program coordinators in registering their event data into the national GKAS data system at ADA.org/GKASsignup.
- Provide a toolkit resource on your website for program coordinators to easily access state specific forms, including regulatory guidelines.
- Help connect dental students, dental team members, and other community workers with program coordinators to volunteer at GKAS events.
- Help connect the public with events in your area.
- Create marketing materials (i.e., county maps, state event calendars, state-specific posters, letters to state legislators, etc).
- Provide your contact information for questions.
- Help the ADA collect the names of dentists in your state who participate in GKAS, so that we may recognize them for their efforts.
- Connect your members to the national website at ADA.org/GKAS or by email at gkas@ADA.org for comprehensive GKAS information/assistance.

Advocacy

- Share your state GKAS data with your oral health coalition at their meetings.
- Invite local, state, federal officials to your events.
- Ask the DC and State Affairs staff for assistance.
