



# **Background Information**

Give Kids A Smile® was launched nationally by the American Dental Association in 2003 to draw attention to the unmet oral health needs of America's children. The program has grown over its 20-year history due to the dedication of the dental profession, including collaborations with Henry Schein Cares, Colgate and other sponsoring organizations and individuals. GKAS events launch annually on the first Friday in February, which is considered the national Give Kids A Smile Kickoff Day. Events then take place throughout the year in different cities across the country.

The ADA provides tools and resources for GKAS program coordinators so they can focus on what they do best: providing much-needed oral health care to children in underserved communities. Each year, approximately 7,000 dentists and 30,000 dental team members volunteer at GKAS events in their communities to provide free oral health education, dental screenings and treatment to about 300,000 children. To date, over 6 million underserved children have received free oral health services through GKAS.

We invite your dental school to join us and *Be Part of the GKAS Movement* to help increase access to care to underserved children in your community.

# Purpose of the Guide

This document provides useful information and resources to assist dental school administrators, staff, and students on how they may participate in the ADA Give Kids A Smile program.

# **GKAS Event Types**

## **Education Only**

The Education Only event includes oral health education, with NO other oral health services provided during the event. Education Only events generally take place in a school setting with the use of posters, props, games and handouts.

## Screening


The Screening event delivers oral health education, visual oral screening, and fluoride varnish applications. This type of event is generally not held in a clinical setting. Therefore, sealants and/or restorative treatment are NOT provided. The event may be held in a school auditorium, museum, or mobile van setting.

#### **Preventive/Restorative**

The Preventive/Restorative event delivers oral health education, screening exam, X-rays, fluoride varnish, dental sealants, extractions, pulpotomies, etc. This type of event takes place in a clinical setting, such as a dental office, dental school, or clinic.



# **Planning Structure**



- **Program Coordinators** Select a small group of motivated, outgoing students and/or faculty to take the lead on planning your GKAS event.
- **Dental Students** Below provides suggestions for how all levels of students may participate in your school event. Note that roles should be decided internally, and depend on the level of training achieved.
  - D1 Oral health education / Front help / Face-painting / Escort kids
  - D2 Preventive care / Cleaning / X-ray / Assisting
  - D3 Sterilization / Dispensing / Clinical work/ Assisting
  - D4 Clinic work
  - Residents More complex clinical work/ Extractions / Pulpotomies
  - Faculty & Administration Provide approvals / Supervise flow of clinic / Triage / Liability
     & Risk Management
- Interprofessional Participation This applies only if school offers other interprofessional disciplines.
  - Nutrition Students teach kids about healthy food groups
  - Medical Students teach kids about the human body
  - Audiology Students conduct hearing screenings
- Recruitment Boys & Girls Clubs / Schools / Churches / Community centers
- Media/Promotion Work with your school's media team to develop a promotion plan Press release / Promotional video / TV / Print / Flyers / Social media
- Sponsorship Product & supply donations / Food donations for kids & volunteers
- Entertainment Face painting / Tooth games / Live DJ / Magician
- ADA GKAS Event registration / Website resources / GKAS product kits

# Setting Up Your Dental School Event

There are a variety of ways to set up a GKAS event at your dental school. Below provides just one example to consider for your event.



#### **Dental Home Station:**

Students at this station can help families understand the importance of a dental home, how to establish one, and provide insurance or Medicaid application assistance. Have handouts available to distribute to parents.



Students at this station can do face painting on those children who would like.

#### **Book Nook Station:**

Students at this station can read or show a book to families. Depending on the number of kids books you have, you may give one book per family.



# Welcome Station

Students at the Welcome Station will be the first ones visited by patients and their families.

You will give them an empty box of crayons.

Explain that they will collect 8 crayons to fill up their box – they must visit each station to get one.

Decorate each station in one of the 8 crayon colors, using tablecloths, balloons, streamers, etc.

Each station will give a crayon in their designated color to children who visit their stand.

#### **Tooth Brushing Station**

Students at this station may demonstrate oral health instructions on puppets.

#### **Nutrition Station:**

Students at this station can help families make a nutrition plate using stickers. Discuss good foods vs. bad foods for dental and overall health.

# Sports Safety & Trauma Station

Those at this station can talk about sports safety and give information about mouth guards. You can explain types of dental emergencies and how to handle.

#### **Goody Bag Station**

Students at this station can give a goody bag to all children. Goody bags may contain a child size toothbrush, a Colgate toothpaste sample, and an oral health education card. Other goody items may be added as well.

**Tooth Games Station:** 

Students at this station will play games with families, talk about good foods and bad foods — and make sure they are having fun.

# **Suggested Timeline**

Give Kids A Smile events can take place during any month of the year. The timeline below provides a sample timeline for those who choose to hold an event in February during National Children's Dental Health month and our national GKAS kickoff

| Month    | Objective  |

| October  | <ul> <li>Register your GKAS information online at gkas.ADA.org.</li> </ul>   |
| November | <ul> <li>Plan and develop your GKAS event.</li> <li>Obtain internal approvals.</li> <li>Assemble an interprofessional student team.</li> <li>Determine locations for recruitment (Boys &amp; Girls Clubs, schools, etc.)</li> <li>Identify roles for students, faculty and staff.</li> </ul> |
| December | <ul><li>Begin the process of recruiting children for your event.</li><li>Develop funding proposals.</li></ul>  |
| January  | <ul> <li>Submit requests for funding/sponsorship.</li> <li>Hire entertainment (face painter, live DJ, magician).</li> <li>Expand recruitment process if needed.</li> </ul>   |
| February | <ul> <li>Confirm patient roster.</li> <li>Prepare event space and implement GKAS program.</li> <li>Submit event data online at gkas.ADA.org.</li> </ul>  |
